Welcome & Introductions



Objective:

• To obtain community feedback on options and transition plans presented tonight.



Board Options Presented to the Community:

- Remain Status Quo for the 2023-24 school year.
- Ganaraska Trail PS becomes a dual track JK/SK-3 and Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS becomes a dual track grade 4-8. Beatrice Strong PS and North Hope Central PS remain status quo.
- Ganaraska Trail PS becomes a dual track JK/SK-4 and Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS becomes a dual track grade 5-8. Beatrice Strong PS and North Hope Central PS remain status quo.
- Ganaraska Trail PS becomes a dual track JK/SK-4, North Hope Central PS becomes a JK-4 school and Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS becoming a dual track grade 5-8. Beatrice Strong PS remains status quo.
- Boundary adjustments between Ganaraska Trail PS, North Hope Central PS and Beatrice Strong PS to balance enrolment between the elementary schools.

Board Options We are Moving Away From:

- Ganaraska Trail PS becomes a dual track JK/SK-4 and Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS becomes a dual track grade 5-8. Beatrice Strong PS and North Hope Central PS remain status quo.
- Ganaraska Trail PS becomes a dual track JK/SK-4, North Hope Central PS becomes a JK-4 school and Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS becoming a dual track grade 5-8. Beatrice Strong PS remains status quo.
- Boundary adjustments between Ganaraska Trail PS, North Hope Central PS and Beatrice Strong PS to balance enrolment between the elementary schools.

Options Proposed by the Community:

- Change in French Immersion program grade cohorts between Ganaraska Tail PS and Beatrice Strong PS (i.e., Ganaraska Trail becomes FI SK-3 and Beatrice Strong becomes FI 4-6). Both schools maintain English stream.
- Establish a second Port Hope area French Immersion program at Beatrice Strong PS.
- Establish a single-track French Immersion program at either Ganaraska Trail PS or Beatrice Strong PS, with English only at the other school.
- Change in grade cohorts between Beatrice Strong PS and Ganaraska Trail PS with Beatrice Strong PS becoming a dual track primary school (i.e., K to 1) and Ganaraska Trail PS becoming a dual track primary/junior school (i.e., 2 – 6).

Plan for 2023-24:

- Remain Status Quo.
- Ganaraska Trail PS continues as a dual track JK/SK to Grade 5 school.
- Beatrice Strong PS continues as a JK to Grade 6 school.
- North Hope Central continues as a JK to Grade 6 school.
- Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS continues as a dual track Grade 6 to 8 school.

What does Status Quo for 2023-24 mean?

- Provide time required to ensure smooth and efficient transition of students, and to complete any renovations, if required.
- Utilize all available space at GTPS as classrooms (i.e., stage area, portion of library) for the 2023-24 school year.
- Explore use of additional portable(s) as a temporary accommodation measure at GTPS for the 2023-24 school year.
- All new registrations for out-of-boundary students will not be accepted.

Plan for 2024-2027:

- Option 1: Change in French Immersion (FI) program grade cohorts between Ganaraska Trail PS and Beatrice Strong PS (i.e., Ganaraska Trail PS becomes FI SK-3 and Beatrice Strong becomes FI 4-6). Both schools maintain English stream (JK-6).
- Option 2: Ganaraska Trail PS becomes a dual track JK/SK-3 and Dr. M.S. Hawkins Senior PS becomes a dual track grade 4-6. A dual track intermediate school (7-8) is established at Port Hope HS.
- Option 3: Establish a second Port Hope area French Immersion program at Beatrice Strong PS.

Option 1: Change in French Immersion (FI) program grade cohorts between Ganaraska Trail PS and Beatrice Strong PS (i.e., Ganaraska Trail PS becomes FI SK-3 and Beatrice Strong becomes FI 4-6). Both schools maintain English stream (JK-6).
